A SPECIAL VISITOR

We had something really special happen at school this week. On Tuesday morning after fitness as the students were just sitting down to some fruit and vegetables to snack on, a beautiful cockatiel flew under the COLA and landed on the reading boxes. It was obvious to us all that this bird was tame. We watched the bird for about 5 mins wondering out loud where it had come from, why was it here, what was the purple ring we could see around it's leg? The bird decided to use a few of the student's heads as a place to rest so we quickly knew just how friendly he (we think it is a boy) was. We offered our new friend some apple, which he happily nibbled on. He was hungry. The bird had the whole school, students and staff mesmerised. We decided as a school, that we would pop it in a box and attempt to find the owner.

The 3-6 students went straight into action and made a plan on how we could try and help this lost bird. We decided to make 'Found' posters for the bottom shop, we would post on local Facebook sites, we would talk to our neighbours at school and we would call Currumbin Wildlife hospital and local vets for advice. We also had Mr Shawn write a message on our school sign at the bottom of the school.

After quickly researching effective posters and detailed description

writing, our plans were in place. I was overwhelmed by the compassion and sensitivity towards this bird. Every student had genuine empathy for the bird and the 'lost' owner. Watching our students dedicate themselves to helping this bird get home was incredibly heart-warming and reassured me as an adult in this world, that our future is safe in the hands of these caring, proactive individuals doing the right thing.

Unfortunately, by the end of the day we had not found our owner. Hayley quickly volunteered to look after the bird. The other students agreed seeing that

Hayley's family are the closest to the school and her family already have a bird. After okaying it with Vanessa and Paul, the bird set off to Hayley's house while we continued our search.

On Wednesday Mrs Flaherty contacted Greenway Dr Vets to see if they knew of any way to track down the bird's owner. They said that they did have someone who had lost a cockatiel and she emailed them a photo and the ID number on the band on it's leg. We are waiting to hear back from the vet clinic to see if this person is the owner. Stay tuned to see how this story ends.
