UPDATE ON LEARNING K-2

Welcome back to Term 4, it's hard to believe we are already in week 4. K-2 students have been working really hard this term during our Literacy sessions to develop their reading and comprehension skills. They are learning to make connections between what they read and their own experiences. This term we have also commenced weekly spelling tests and all the students have really impressed me with their enthusiasm and spelling knowledge!

In our 'Monsters' writing unit, students have been exploring how authors use descriptive language to create different characters. They have been developing their own writing skills with the use of descriptive language for the purpose of engaging their audience. Our main focus has been on the use of capital letters, full stops and finger spaces throughout our writing.


K-2 students have been sharing their news in our weekly Show and Tell – Talk Time sessions. They have been speaking about some of their favourite things, including their home, toys and places. Not only is Show and Tell lots of fun, it also builds confidence and enhances students' speaking and listening skills. Students are required to organise their thoughts and convey main ideas, all of which are skills that can be used throughout their lives.

In Maths, we have been taking part in many hands-on activities to help students understand a variety of concepts. We have been observing and playing with different patterns. Kindergarten students have been learning to skip count by 2's and 5's and Year 1 students have been extending their skills in skip counting by 3,'s and 4's. We have also looked at the months of the year, how many days are in each month and which months are a part of which season.

Students are really enjoying our Science Unit – Living World. We have been learning all about the external features of living things (animals and plants). We are lucky enough to be surrounded by nature here at

Carool, so we are able to explore our beautiful school grounds to discover and investigate these living things in their own habitat. Students have really enjoyed the hands-on learning experiences this unit has provided so far.


WORLD TEACHER'S DAY

School Travel 2022



2022 school travel applications are now open

Students who need a School Opal card or travel pass for 2022 can apply now. A new application will need to be submitted if students are applying for a school travel pass for the first time, or if they are requesting an additional travel entitlement as a result of a new shared parental responsibility situation (e.g. joint custody).

Students who change address, school, campus location, or who have repeated a year or received an expiry notification from Transport for NSW for their school travel entitlement should <u>renew or update</u> their details before the **end of term 4.** This will ensure that schools can endorse applications and current entitlements are updated and remain valid.

If a student's distance eligibility has changed based on their grade the system will automatically update their entitlement if they meet the new criteria. If they do not meet the new eligibility criteria, they will receive an expiry notification via email.

Students living in rural and regional (R&R) areas should receive their travel pass at the start of the new school year from their nominated transport operator. It may come via the school or be sent directly to them at home.
