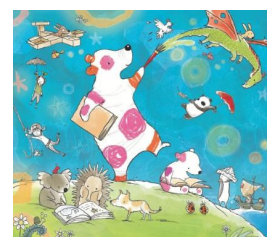
Gold Coast Rec Camp

Helen Keller – gratitude

Helen Keller was born in 1880 in Alabama, U.S. She was a healthy little baby. When she was 19 months old, she became very ill. The illness left her deaf and blind.

Helen found it very difficult to communicate with people. When Helen was seven years old, her family decided to find a teacher for her. With the help of Annie Sullivan, her teacher and guide, she learned how to read and write and communicate with others. Helen was the first blind woman to gain a degree from university.

As Helen grew older, she wanted to help other people like herself. She wanted to inspire them and give them hope.

She spent many years travelling around the USA and Europe to tell people of her experiences and raise the profile of people with disabilities.

Given the difficulties Helen Keller faced, she might have felt that there was nothing she had to be grateful for. Instead the opposite is true – she said..

“So much has been given to me that I have not had time to ponder that which has not.” and “Be happy with what you have while working for what you want.”

Developing our attitude for gratitude is like exercising – it’s a **choice** we make and it takes **practice**.

Take the time to appreciate and be thankful for what you have, instead of focusing on what we don’t have.
