## Breakfast Club recipe

Making a variety of foods for Breakfast Club has provided an opportunity for the students to learn some cooking skills and try different foods. This week, we made Breakfast Quiche ... which can be enjoyed at any meal of the day. Here is our recipe. You can add some other vegies, like corn, onion or tomato, if you like. The recipe can also be cooked in a large dish rather than individual muffins.

### Breakfast Quiche

4 eggs, beaten  
2 tablespoons SR flour – heaped  
1 zucchini, grated  
1 carrot, grated  
100g ham, chopped  
½ cup grated cheese

Mix eggs and flour together.  
Mix in other ingredients.  
Lightly grease a 6-hole muffin tray.  
Spoon mixture into muffin tray.  
Cook 20 mins at 180°C.  
Cool slightly.  
Run a knife around the edge of each quiche before turning out.

Aurora College is NSW's virtual school, offering a mix of online and residential school classes for high potential and gifted students in rural and remote government schools.

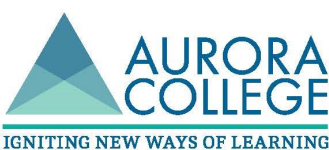
The school provides innovative, flexible learning in a whole new context, by allowing students to connect locally and to learn globally.
