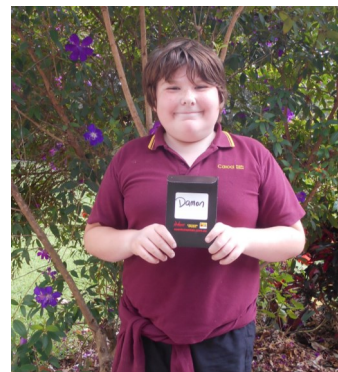
Small Schools Ball Games Carnival

UPDATE ON LEARNING 3-6

Years 3-6 have continued their journey in Australia's history with detailed exploration of Australia's history in war and conflict as well as the impact these have had on immigration and refugees in Australia. Students responded to and composed powerful and moving poetry to capture the bravery, impacts and costs of war. We learnt about the story of our donated Anzac Bear, Trooper Jones as a member of the Light horse Brigade in WW1 and read the stories of the boys and men who fought in this brigade. We are hoping to create an anthology of students' poetry about war as part of our recognition of the Centenary of Remembrance which will occur in November this year.



We have been applying all of our skills across the four operations to investigate patterns and algebra these last two weeks and Stage 3 have thoroughly enjoyed the chance to work with some pre-algebra concepts and processes and Stage 2 can not only identify patterns in numbers but also continue them to find later terms in the pattern across all four operations. The students should be very proud of how they have used goal setting in mental computation skills to achieve so much in all areas of Mathematics.

I wish all the students in 3-6 a wonderful Term 4, I will certainly miss teaching them and their love of learning, passion for discussion and incredible independence to work in a multi-age classroom.

UPDATE ON LEARNING K-2

The term is almost over and K-2 have been wrapping up the units of work they have been engaging in. In writing we have been improving our writing by showing the reader what is happening using our adjectives and verbs. By doing this we are helping to paint a picture for our readers. Furthermore, the students have all finished their research task on their favourite animal and converted this information into an informative writing piece. We now know many interesting facts about our wildlife.

In maths we have been focusing on subtraction by counting back using a number of different card games. The students have shown great improvement in subtraction due to our daily buzz off game which requires students to count back from 100. We have also been looking at different shapes and learning what tessellation and symmetry is.

In history, the students have been learning about the history of our local Mount Warning. We now know that Mount Warning is a shield volcano and how it is sacred to Bundjalung people. The students looked at how this area helped local Aboriginal people survival and why it is so popular within our region. This week was the last of our puppet pals program where the students learnt about how to greet each other and the importance of using kind language.

Non-Teaching Staff School Introduction Training Days

The Department of Education is seeking people who are interested in commencing work within public schools in your area.

The School Administrative and Support (SAS) Staff Reference Group welcome any people looking to start work in school administration to enrol in our Non-Teaching Staff School Introduction training programs.

The aim of this training is to provide participants with an overview of school administrative roles. Participation in these introduction days are **not** a guarantee of employment with the Department of Education. Participants are required to obtain a Working with Children Check (WWCC) clearance for paid work at their own cost. <https://www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au/child-safe-organisations/working-with-children-check>. Payment is then made through Service NSW prior to attending day one. To enable processing for potential employment, participants are required to bring necessary completed forms, which appear on the MyPL registration page. Many schools have a policy of not employing current parents or associates within their own school.

It would be desirable if participants had a sound knowledge of the Microsoft Office suite.

The training days will be held in the following locations:

Tweed Heads South Public School – Wednesday 24 October & Tuesday 13 November 2018
Macleay Public School – Wednesday 24 October & Tuesday 13 November 2018
William Bayldon Public School – Wednesday 24 October & Tuesday 13 November 2018
Frederickton Public School – Friday 26 October & Friday 9 November 2018
Port Macquarie Library – Thursday 25 October & Wednesday 7 November 2018
Forster office – Monday 22 October 2018 & Tuesday 6 November 2018

To secure a place in this course, participants will need to register online as a community member on MyPL. Go to the following site <https://mypl.education.nsw.gov.au/> and select Register. After completing the details, an email will be sent with instructions on how to get started and select the venue you wish to attend. The course codes are Day 1: NR22842, Day 2: NR22844.

There will be no cost to the participant other than them acquiring their WWCC prior to attending the training. Tea and coffee will be available throughout the day. Participants are to provide their own morning tea and lunch.
